### The Curriculum

The National Curriculum provides pupils with an introduction to the <u>essential knowledge</u> that they need to be educated citizens. It introduces pupils to the best that has been thought and said; and helps engender an appreciation of <u>human creativity</u> and <u>achievement</u>.

#### Assessment

- When we are assessing each child's progress we measure them against age related expectations.
- We measure the progress across the year. At the start of Year 3 most children will be Year 3 Emerging.
- By the end of Year 3, the expectation is that most children will be Year 3 secure.
- Throughout the year the children will progress through emerging, developing and secure.
- If your child is working below age related expectations they may receive additional support, which will be discussed between parents and teachers.

# Pupil Progress

- <u>December</u>: Pupil progress report will be sent out to parents, explaining how your child is performing in all subject areas.
   <u>October</u>/ March: Parents evening
- July: End of year report will be sent out to parents.

## What Your Child Needs

- Children need to be in school in their PE kits on a <u>Friday</u>.
- Ensure earrings are taken out before PE.
- A warm coat as we are heading into autumn and winter.
- Water bottle please do not put squash in them. Need to have a water bottle in school everyday.
- Please ensure that everything your child brings to school is named, including shoes.

### What Your Child Needs to be doing ...

- Reading at least <u>three times a week</u> it is important children are reading a variety of books aloud. Children need to have their reading book and reading record in school everyday.
- Support with homework: Maths <u>Key Instant Recall Facts</u> (KIRFs) will come home every half term. Please ensure you are practicing these at home.
- Children will also be sent weekly <u>Mymaths homework</u> and <u>half termly project</u> homework to complete.
- Children have access to <u>Bug Club</u> which is updated with books throughout the year. They also have a log in for <u>Times Table Rockstars</u> which supports their times table learning.
