We have had a wonderful time exploring our topic “**Animals**” over the past few weeks, and the children have been fully engaged in a range of exciting, hands-on learning experiences. We began our journey by learning about **vets**, where the children enjoyed role-playing in our veterinary clinic, caring for animals and learning about how to keep pets healthy. This led us to create our very own **Pet Palace**, where we discussed how to look after animals at home and what they need to be happy and safe.

Our classroom then transformed into a vibrant **jungle**, full of exploration and discovery. The children loved learning about different jungle animals and their habitats, using their imaginations through storytelling and creative play. Next, we visited life on the **farm**, where we learned about farm animals and the important role farmers play.
