## Nursery Curriculum Newsletter

This half term we have been learning about minibeasts! The children have been exploring how these tiny creatures live, move and help our environment. We started by planting flowers to create a welcoming space for insects to visit and thrive. The children have enjoyed caring for the plants and noticing which minibeasts come to explore our growing garden.

One of our most exciting activities was making ‘snail soup’. This fun experiment let us observe how snails behave and move when they’re placed in a safe, natural mixture of leaves and water. The children carefully watched how the snails interacted, leaving silvery trails and curling into their shells.

We also continued our learning in the forest searching for worms, beetles, ants, butterflies and slugs. Our young explorers are developing a real respect for the tiny but mighty minibeasts that play such important roles in nature.
